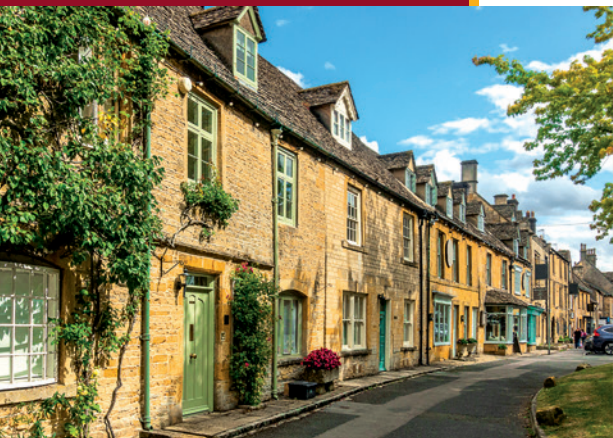

STOW-ON-THE-WOLD

At nearly 800ft above sea level, Stow is the highest of the Cotswold towns and is on the ancient Roman Fosse Way. At its heart is the attractive Market Square surrounded by mellow stone townhouses, independent shops, cafés, teashops and traditional inns.

Look out for the ancient market cross, medieval market stocks and the impressive St Edward's Hall at the centre of the square.

In 1646, the Battle of Stow-on-the-Wold saw the defeat of the last royalist field army. St Edward's Church became a temporary prison for the defeated troops and some of the damage inflicted then is still visible today.

MORETON-IN-MARSH

A long history of trade is reflected in the elegant 17th and 18th-century Cotswold stone buildings that line the broad High Street. Today, a lively market, galleries, craft fairs, delis and cafés welcome visitors from far and wide.

The White Hart Royal was once the manor house where King Charles I sheltered, and the rare Curfew Tower still has its original clock and bell.

Just outside the town, the Four Shire Stone marks where Gloucestershire, Warwickshire, Worcestershire and Oxfordshire meet, thought to have inspired Tolkien's Three-Farthing Stone in The Lord of the Rings.

Every Tuesday the High Street is buzzing with the largest open-air street market in the Cotswolds..

Barely changed for over 400 years, this Jacobean house built between 1607 and 1612 is an atmospheric time capsule.

Many original features still exist today because of the lack of funds over the following centuries. It's now owned by the National Trust.

It has the longest-surviving barrel-vaulted ceiling of its date in England. The two grotesque mask heads at the west end are extremely rare survivals from the 1600s, intended to deter evil spirits.

It's also home to tapestries woven by hand in Flanders between 1560 and 1580, rare Jacobite glass and family portraits.
